This	s report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns:
X	A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
X	The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
	The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
	The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

"Today, April 26, 2015 at 9:31 am the one-year-old subject child died as a result of sustaining multiple injuries indicative of Shaken Baby Syndrome. The subject child had the following injuries: bilateral retinal hemorrhaging, subdural hematoma, spinal injury and fracture, rib fractures, abdominal injury of the left lobe of the liver and chip fractures on the left and right wrist. There is no explanation that is consistent with how the subject child received these injuries, however the injuries were inflicted and non-accidental in nature. The injuries the subject child received occurred over a seven to ten day period while she was in the care of the mother, father, babysitter, uncle and mother's boyfriend."

Executive Summary

This report concerns the death of a one-year-old child whose family had no significant history with Child Protective Services prior to the incident that resulted in the child's death. Two SCR reports with allegations of PDAM, IG and LOM were received the day the child was found unresponsive and taken to the hospital after having sustained what would be fatal injuries. The child had been dropped off to be babysat at her maternal uncle and his girlfriend's home by the mother on her way to work. The child had been seen at two different Emergency rooms in the week and month prior to her death with non specific symptoms of being weak, lethargic and vomiting. In both instances the child was evaluated, treated for symptoms and discharged. No report was made to the SCR in either instance. On the 4/24/15 she was found limp and unresponsive by the babysitter who contacted the mother and then eventually called 911. Although the child presented not breathing, without a pulse and no explanation for her condition the physician at Olean General Hospital was adamant that there was no abuse and no SCR report was received. Once medical interventions re-established a pulse the child was transferred to WCHOB in grave condition. Medical staff at WCHOB found significant evidence of abuse including evidence of Shaken Baby Syndrome with subdural hematoma, bilateral retinal hemorrhages, a fractured and dislocated spine, rib fractures, chip fractures of both wrists and injury to the liver. The child was suspected to be brain dead which was confirmed and she was taken off life support on 4/26/15.

The Erie County Medical Examiner completed an autopsy of the subject child on 4/27/15. The Cause of Death was determined to be Blunt Force Injuries of the Head and Torso with the Manner of Death as Homicide.

An SCR report and a duplicate report were received regarding the fatality on 4/26/15 which contained allegations of DOA/FAT, CTS, II, FX and IG. All of the adults who had contact with the child were named as subjects on the reports; the mother, father, mother's boyfriend, maternal uncle and his girlfriend. Cattaraugus County Child Protective Services (CCCPS) worked closely with the Salamanca Police Department (SPD) during the investigation. Interviews were conducted with all of the adults and two of three other children who were in the home of the maternal uncle and his girlfriend at the time the child was found unresponsive. The uncle's girlfriend also babysat her five-year-old niece and four-year-old nephew and the couple also had a one-year-old son. A safety plan was put in place for all of these children which prohibited unsupervised contact between the adults and the children until it was determined how the subject child was injured. CCCPS made referrals for grief counseling, drug treatment and reviewed safe sleeping information with the uncle and his girlfriend.

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The SPD arrested the mother on 5/19/15 and charged her with Manslaughter 2nd, Reckless Endangerment 1st and Endangering the Welfare of a Child in connection to the death of the subject child. The mother was jailed and is currently awaiting trial.

CCCPS substantiated the allegations of DOA/FAT, CTS, II. IG and LOM against the mother on 6/24/15 due to the injuries inflicted on the subject child and her subsequent death. Allegations of DOA/FAT, CTS, II, FX, IG and LOM were unsubstantiated regarding the father, mother's boyfriend, maternal uncle and his girlfriend as they did not cause the injuries to the subject child. Allegations of PDAM and IG were substantiated against the uncle and his girlfriend on 6/24/15 as when the police responded to the home for the 911 call they found drugs accessible to the children and subsequently obtained text messages from the girlfriend's home that they felt confirmed drug use and sales and that the children were likely present. CCCPS referred the uncle and his girlfriend to the Seneca Nation of Indians for drug treatment.

LDSS Response

CCCPS was called by the Salamanca Police Department (SPD) on 4/24/15 about an unresponsive baby that was taken to

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Olean General Hospital (OGH). CCCPS worked closely with SPD. The SC had been at the home of her MU and his girlfriend, who was the SC's babysitter. The SPD went to the 911 call with the ambulance/EMS. The family is Native American and requested representation from the Seneca Nation of Indians (SNI) with whom CCCPS worked closely. Two SCR reports were received on 4/24/15 with allegations of IG, PDAM and LOM about injuries to the SC and drugs that were found in the home of the MU and his girlfriend when the police arrived at the 911 call. The MU and his girlfriend were caring for their one-year-old child, the girlfriend's niece, age 5 and nephew, age 4. Upon the SC's death the fatality report was received with allegations of DOA/FAT,CTS, II and IG on 4/26/15 and a duplicate fatality report on 4/27/15. All of the adults who had contact with the SC were listed on the reports as subjects.

CCCPS interviewed sources, all family members, medical and police. It was found that the SC was dropped off at the MU and his girlfriend's home by the SM at 9:45am on 4/24/15. The MU's girlfriend put the SC to sleep at about 10:30am until noon when she went to wake the SC and noticed that the SC was limp. She texted the SM who texted that the SC had been like that lately and the SF was on the way there to take the SC to Women and Children's Hospital of Buffalo (WCHOB) as the SC had been to OGH on 4/22/15 and she was concerned about how the SC was acting. On 4/22/15 an x-ray and lab work was done, she was given fluids and discharged to SM. The MU's girlfriend noticed the SC wasn't breathing right and called the SM who told her to call 911 which she did. The 911 operator told her to start CPR which she also did until EMS arrived.

The SC arrived at OGH not breathing, without a pulse and was transferred to WCHOB once a pulse was restored. At WCHOB a CT scan showed evidence of shaken baby syndrome as well as bilateral retinal hemorrhages, subdural hematoma, spinal and rib fractures that were approximately 7 to 10 days old. It was later discovered that the SC had chip fractures of both wrists, an injury to the left lobe of the liver and had blood and fluid in her abdomen. The SC's prognosis was very poor.

A safety plan was put in place by CCCPS for the other children (OC) that were in the MU and his girlfriend's home which prohibited unsupervised contact with the OC by any of the adults named as subjects in the reports until it was determined how the SC was injured.

CCCPS was notified that the SC died on 4/26/15 at 9:31am. An autopsy was conducted by the Erie County Medical Examiner's Office (ECME) on 4/27/15. The ECME determined the Cause of Death to be due to Blunt Force Injuries of the Head and Torso and the Manner of Death as Homicide. CCCPS obtained copies of medical records for the SC and the (OC), the ER and hospital records for the SC and spoke to medical staff at OGH that cared for the SC on 4/22/15 and 4/24/15. The ER physician who saw the SC on 4/24/15 opined there was no abuse. The OC were medically cleared. CCCPS spoke to the OC on 5/4/15 who had no information about the SC's injuries or drug use in the home.

The SM was arrested by the SPD on 5/19/15 and charged with Manslaughter 2nd, Reckless Endangerment 1st and Endangering the Welfare of a Child. Trial is scheduled for May 2016.

On 6/24/15 CCCPS substantiated the allegations of DOA/FAT, CTS, II, IG and LOM against the SM due to the injuries to the SC and failure to obtain medical care for the SC. These allegations were unsubstantiated for the other adult subjects. The allegations of PDAM and IG were substantiated against the MU and his girlfriend due to drugs present and in reach of the children in their home, the SPD had evidence confirming drug use/sales and the probability the OC were likely present.

A safety plan was put in place for the three children present in the babysitter's home following discovery of the injuries to the SC and remained in place until it was determined that the MU and his girlfriend had no role in inflicting the injuries to the SC. Report Summary:

CCCPS received a report from the SCR which alleged that the one-year-old subject child (SC) and three other children (OC) ages 1, 4 and 5 were maltreated because the adults in the home, the SC's maternal uncle (MU) and his girlfriend who babysat all four children were selling drugs out of the home with drugs and paraphernalia accessible to the children. The report stated that the uncle's girlfriend put the SC down for a nap and when the SC woke up she was sluggish, turned blue and became unresponsive. 911 was called and the SC was taken to the hospital. The uncle's girlfriend had no explanation for what happened to the SC. The MU and his girlfriend are the parents of the one-year-old OC.

Determination: Indicated **Date of Determination:** 06/24/2015

Basis for Determination:

CCCPS substantiated the allegations and indicated the report because when the police responded to the 911 call regarding the SC not breathing they found marijuana and pain pills in the home and suspected that there were drug sales out of the home. The MU and his girlfriend admitted smoking marijuana but denied doing so with the children present. The investigation conclusion stated that the police confirmed that text messages were sent from the girlfriend's phone that confirmed drug sales were happening from the home and most likely when the children were present. Because drug use and sales were happening where the children lived and were babysat the report was indicated.

OCFS Review Results:

The OCFS review of the case record and documentation did not find information that drug use or sales occurred in the presence of the children other than a reference in the investigation conclusion that the police had or saw text messages from the girlfriend's phone that they felt confirmed drug sales from the home. The reference stated the police stated that the children were likely present however this was not confirmed. Interviews conducted with the 4 and 5 year old OC did not contain any information about drug use or sales in the home. Although the MU and his girlfriend confirmed smoking

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marijuana they denied doing so with the children present. The girlfriend had a Rx for the pain pills.

Issue:

Appropriateness of allegation determination

Summary:

Review of case record did not document drug use or sales with the children present. The conclusion states that the police saw text messages from the girlfriend's phone confirming drug sales in the home and they felt the children were likely present. Interviews of the 4 and 5 year old OC did not show drug use or sales. The MU and his girlfriend confirmed drug use but denied children were present.

Report Summary:

CCCPS received a report from the SCR which stated that on 4/22/15 the SC was lethargic and vomiting and that the SM took the child to the ER and although the child was prescribed an antibiotic she did not improve. The SC continued to display the same symptoms on 4/23/15 and also did not urinate at all and the SM could barely wake the SC. Neither the SM or her boyfriend sought medical care for the SC. On 4/24/15 the SC's condition was the same and the SM brought the SC to the babysitter and went to work. The babysitter texted the mother about the child's poor condition and the SM told the babysitter to call 911. CPR was done for over thirty minutes and the SC is in ICU and likely brain dead.

Determination: Indicated **Date of Determination:** 06/24/2015

Basis for Determination:

CCCPS substantiated the allegations against the SM based on the SM's actions in shaking the SC and then taking her to the babysitter's and not getting medical care for the SC. The SC died as a result of the injuries inflicted by the SM. The allegations against the babysitter and the SM's boyfriend were unsubstantiated as the SM's boyfriend was not a person legally responsible for the SC and the babysitter did not know the SM had injured the SC and acted appropriately when the SC was unresponsive by calling 911 for help for the SC.

OCFS Review Results:

OCFS review found that CCCPS investigation included appropriate safety and risk assessments. Collateral contacts were made during the investigation and the information was incorporated into the case decisions.

Explain: The SC had been evaluated, treated and discharged by medical staff at Olean General Hospital (OGH) Emergency Room (ER) two days before being found unresponsive prior to her death. The injuries she sustained in the seven to ten days prior to her death (fractures of her spine and ribs) went undiagnosed and no SCR report was made. Upon being evaluated at OGH and transferred to Women and Children's Hospital of Buffalo with fatal injuries, the ER physician at OGH who treated her stated to CCCPS that there was no sign of abuse and that he would stake his reputation on it. Again no SCR report was made. It is recommended that CCCDSS and the Southern Tier Child Fatality Review Team offer and facilitate Mandated Reporter training including recognizing physical indicators of child abuse or maltreatment to medical staff at OGH, specifically to the ER staff including physicians. Training by a physician knowledgeable in identification of child abuse or maltreatment is recommended.

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
